

A list of speakers is to be confirmed, but will cover personal insights, local projects and support services, as well as general advice.







What's on When

Volunteers Needed for a Clinical Trial

Taking part in a clinical trial

Clinical trials are a vital part of searching for better treatments and a cure for Parkinson's. They rely on participants to help understand the potential benefits of a new treatment before it can become available. If clinical trials fail to recruit enough participants, important new treatments could be delayed by years, or risk never being made available at all.

Help manage symptoms

Trial for a wrist worn device assisting daily life of people with Parkinson's.

Professor Richard Walker (Consultant Physician Clinical Lead for the Northumbria Parkinson's disease (PD) service) and his research team have designed a wristworn device (cue band) that can send vibration prompts for swallowing as well as being able to help monitor symptoms for people with Parkinson's.

WHO: 2,700 people with Parkinson's who have access to a smart phone are needed.

WHAT: Participants will be given a device to be worn on the wrist, and asked to give feedback to the research team about any problems and suggestions for improvement.



Participants will be able to keep the wrist-worn device.
